The contractors at West have been working through the Thanksgiving break to keep production going! With all the dirt that was previously removed, they are now starting to backfill the area as they continue grading the site. In construction, grading involves shaping and leveling the ground to create a stable, even surface for the building while ensuring proper drainage throughout the area.

With the groundwork nearing completion, contractors are outlining the building footings, which will serve as the foundation for the new MPR structure. A proper foundation is one of the most critical elements of any building. It literally supports everything above it - structurally, financially, and for long-term safety.

Our contractors have been working very carefully to complete this phase of construction and soon we will start to see the structural framing!

Crocker Multi-Purpose Room and Administration Building:

Designers are currently awaiting feedback from the Division of the State Architect (DSA) on the submitted project plans. The DSA review ensures that all designs meet the required safety and accessibility standards for California schools. Once DSA approval is received, the project team will move forward with final preparations for construction, which is anticipated to begin in summer 2026. We look forward to sharing more updates as the project moves closer to the construction phase.
