
# Chalk Talk FALL 2025

# Measure H: Investing in Our Schools and Community

In 2022, our community came together to invest in the future of our schools and students. To ensure that facilities remain safe, modern, and conducive to learning, the HCSD School Board unanimously voted on February 16, 2022, to place Measure H—a local school improvement bond—on the June ballot. The measure passed with 61% voter approval, securing up to \$140 million to fund essential upgrades and repairs across our schools. Below is a summary of the projects that are ongoing or were recently completed.

#### Measure H Projects Completed Over the Summer 2025

HCSD has completed several major projects funded by **Measure H** this summer. These improvements continue our commitment to providing safe, modern, and inspiring learning environments for all students and staff.

#### Crocker Middle School

- New HVAC systems were installed within the main building, ensuring comfortable learning environments year-round.
- The main building and gymnasium received brand-new roofs.
- Phase 1 of the new Culinary Arts classroom was completed, including moving the classroom from the MPR to the main building and converting the space. Phase 2 will occur during the summer of 2026.
- A large Town of Hillsborough water main that ran under the existing Crocker MPR was rerouted in preparation for Summer 2026 ground breaking of the new Crocker MPR and administration building.
- Installation of security cameras, guest management system and ActVNet first responder access was completed, improving security and response during emergencies.

#### North Elementary School

 Installation of security cameras, guest management system, and ActVNet first responder access was completed, improving security and response during emergencies.

#### South Elementary School

- New shingled roofs were installed on the main building, MPR and iLab/Music building.
- HVAC systems installed within all learning spaces.
- A new fire alarm system was installed in all campus buildings.
- Installation of security cameras, guest management system and ActVNet first responder access was completed.

#### West Elementary School

- The underground water and utility waste lines within the main building and the sewer lift station were replaced.
- HVAC systems and new roofs were installed within three classrooms that were not done last summer. This completes the installation of HVAC and new roofs for all of the West campus.
- The two staff restrooms within the Staff Dining Room were renovated.
- Installation of security cameras, guest management system and ActVNet first responder access was completed.

With this summer's work, HCSD has successfully completed the roofing, sewer, and security camera projects under the Measure H "Safe, Cool, Warm, and Dry" initiative. These efforts ensure our schools remain secure, comfortable, and well-maintained for years to come.

#### West School: New Multipurpose Room Broke Ground in June 2025

Construction is officially underway! Contractors are nearing the completion of the underground utility tie-ins and leveling the ground to create a stable and even surface for the building while ensuring proper drainage throughout the area. They are currently marking and preparing the building footings, which will serve as the foundation for the new MPR structure.

The completion date of the new MPR is scheduled for Winter 2027. Construction will occur five days a week, with potential weekend work if needed to stay on schedule. Expect increased traffic and typical construction noise around Barbara Way. We are committed to minimizing disruptions and will follow stringent environmental guidelines to mitigate dust and noise. Blach Construction, known for its efficiency and quality in previous school projects, is handling the construction.
